Season & Hours of Operation: Guided Tours are available year round, 9 a.m. – 4:30 p.m., 7 days a week. **Prime time** for guided tours is in July and August.

Group Rates: 2014 prices set at \$6 / person (CDN) (minimum \$90 (CDN) per group).

Time Required: Allow 1.5 – 2 hours.

Reservation Policy: Three weeks notice, however reservations may be made up to 1 calendar year in advance.

Cancellation Policy: Three weeks notice, or invoiced for 50% of the total cost of tour.

Complimentary Policy: Tour Agency guide and bus driver.

Payment Arrangements: Payment can be made on the destination day of visit. Cash, Debit, Cheque, U.S. Funds, Fair Exchange. **CREDIT CARDS NOT ACCEPTED.**

Driving Approach:

- In Longwoods Road Conservation Area, on Middlesex County Road 2 (8348 Longwoods Road, Mount Brydges)
- 6.5 km (4 miles) west of the village of Delaware or 10 km (6 miles) east of the village of Melbourne.
- From Hwy. 401 take exit 157 and watch for signs. From Hwy. 402 take exit 86 and watch for signs.
- Located 20 minutes west of London, Ontario, Canada and one hour east of Chatham, Ontario, Canada.
- Approximately 3 hours west of Toronto, 2 hours east of Windsor and Detroit and 1 hour from Sarnia and Port Huron.
- A variety of restaurants and accommodations are available in neighbouring cities within a half hour's drive.

Description of Tour & Facilities:

- Ska-Nah-Doht is a recreated village of 1,000 years ago located in the natural surroundings of Longwoods Road Conservation Area. There are 16 structures including longhouses and a palisade with a maze.
- Guide to explain Village and Haudenosaunee (longhouse) culture of 1,000 year ago, walking tour of Village, DVD theatre presentation, indoor exhibits with artifacts displayed in Resource Centre and Museum.
- Village brochures available in French, Italian, Spanish, German and Dutch.
- Village is wheelchair accessible (one all-terrain wheelchair on-site for customer use free of charge).
- The modern, air conditioned and wheelchair accessible Resource Centre and Museum has Conservation and Native history displays.
- You can view an audiovisual presentation in our Theatres.
- Souvenirs are available at our Turtle Trail Gift Shop highlighting local Native crafts.
- Hot or cold beverages are for sale.
- A barbeque pavilion, with hydro and water service, or a picnic site is available for your group to bring and enjoy a picnic or box lunch. Drinking water and washroom facilities are located in the Resource Centre and Museum and next to the barbeque pavilion.
- Longwoods Road Conservation Area has 6 km (4 mi.) of natural walking trails winding through 63 hectares (155 acres) of Carolinian Forest and Marshland. Two nature trails are wheelchair accessible.
